SHELBY GT500-H DEBUTS AS 900 HP RENTAL MONSTER

Functional states of the term of term

Hertz is teaming up with Shelby American for the new Mustang Shelby GT500-H and Shelby GT-H. Shelby American will build both models at its facility in Las Vegas and then ship them to Hertz airport-based rental fleets across the U.S., where interested customers can rent one of the special edition models. The GT500-H is no ordinary machine, however, as the supercharged Ford 5.2L V8 Predator underhood has been treated to modifications that increase horsepower from 760 to over 900, making it the most powerful rental car Shelby has ever built. The GT-H, on the other hand, comes equipped with a Borla cat-back performance exhaust for its Ford 5.0L V8 Coyote powerplant.

On the outside, all 2022 Shelby Mustang Hertz models are equipped with a host of unique features that set them apart, visually speaking. Nineteen of the Shelby GT500-H models built will wear Shadow Black exterior paint and six will be finished in in Oxford White to honor Shelby American's 60th anniversary.

The Shelby GT-H fastbacks and convertibles will be available in Rapid Red Metallic, Oxford White, Carbonized Gray, and Shadow Black. All will feature gold "Le Mans" dual racing stripes and set of special rocker stripes, along with Hertz Edition and Shelby 60th anniversary emblems, aluminum forged mono-block wheels, performance spec tires, tinted windows, Shelby badges, and both driver- and passenger-side stripes.

Inside, Shelby and Hertz logos are featured on the seats, sill plates, and floor mats with a numbered badge located on the dash and under the hood, where the supercharger on the Shelby GT500-H is finished in gold to match Hertz's livery. Meanwhile, the Shelby GT-H rides on 20-inch aluminum wheels wrapped with allweather Michelin tires and is also equipped with a Shelbydesigned deep-draw hood, upper grille, fascia winglets, and taillight panel.

The Mustang Shelby GT500-H will be available to rent in Fort Myers, Las Vegas, Miami, Orlando, Phoenix, and Tampa. The Mustang Shelby GT-H



convertibles and coupes will be available in Atlanta, Dallas, Fort Lauderdale, Fort Myers, Las Vegas, Los Angeles, Miami, Orlando, Phoenix, San Diego, San Francisco, and Tampa.

NATIONAL MUSTANG DAY 2022

pril 16th started as a cloudy & somewhat cool day and, as a dedicated group of Mustangs started assembling in the parking lot of a WaWa, it appeared to be getting darker. But this was the GSRMC's NMD 2022 celebration and they would not be deterred.

We all know that the real birthday of the Mustang is April 17th, but with that being Easter Sunday this year we moved our event to Saturday along with just about every other club that commemorated the event. Our plan was to have two groups from different areas of northern NJ cruise to a location, Performance Ford, that was near the midpoint of the two locations. About thirty Mustangs left from the Lodi location and another thirty or so cruised over from Rockaway. When the first group arrived, there were probably another thirty or more Mustangs already in the lot. When the dust settled around 10:30 am, 118 Mustangs had filled the dealership lot in East Hanover. There were 4-cylinders, 6-cylinders, 8-clyinders, Sprints, GTs, GTCSs, Mach Is, Bullitts, SVTs, Shelbys, Roushes, Saleens, and a Mach E GT. There were coupes, convertibles, sportsroofs, 2+2s and hatchbacks, stock, modified, daily drivers and show cars. And don't even get me started on the colors. Unfortunately, the only model we didn't have was a second-generation, Mustang II.

Performance Ford was an excellent host and provided us with complimentary coffee, doughnuts, and hot dogs. Participants were asked to bring non-perishable food items and we collected almost 600 pounds of food that was donated to Interfaith Food Pantry of Morris County. Did I mention that by that time, the sun had come out and it felt more like a mid-April day.

After two hours of eating and talking Mustangs, it was time to head to our second destination. The East Hanover police were gracious enough to stop by and block off a lane of traffic so our Mustangs could all safely exit the parking lot. Some people chose to take the quickest route while the rest enjoyed a 45-minute trip through the hills of Morris County. stopped traffic at key intersections. When the long line of scenic cruisers arrived at Tranquility Farms in Chester, they found another long line of Mustangs waiting for them.

The plan was to park all the cars together at the farm to get a group photo. Well, you can imagine how long it takes to get, now 80+, Mustangs organized into tight rows and that's about how long it took. Everyone was patient and willing to cooperate for the creation of the photographic masterpiece we were looking to achieve. After our photographer, Jonathan Collins, and many others,

including a drone, got their shots it was time to eat. The club provided sandwiches, wraps, and drinks for everyone.

A young woman brought out a handsome white horse and everyone had the opportunity to have their picture taken with it. The scenic locale also proved to be a popular background for individual pictures.

Three o'clock arrived before we knew it and everyone started to slowly make their way to the exit, vowing to return for NMD 2023.

When Bill Chernack and I started planning this event we wanted to have an event that GSRMC members

would be able to enjoy but we also felt that it was important to invite all Mustang owners, regardless of whether they belonged to the GSRMC or not. Besides meeting some great new Mustang people, we added 16 new members that day and overall, over 30 new members and renewals since we started advertising the event. We felt that on NMD particularly, it was our club's responsibility to promote the hobby and judging by our membership increase and all the people amazed by the line of Mustangs cruising past them we succeeded.

I was also invited to call into a live radio show to talk about our celebration and we were the subject

of a front-page newspaper and online article by a reporter that was at the event.

I would like to thank Bill C. for his tireless efforts to ensure that this would be an event to remember. Thanks also to the folks at Performance Ford and Tranquility Farms as well as the police departments that helped us. Thanks also to the members who lent a hand that day and Jonathan Collins and everyone else whose pictures I have included here. Finally, thanks to all of you who participated and made NMD 2022 a day to remember.
