The event was held at Barber Motorsports Park which is a world class road racing facility. The track and its surrounding landscape had several elevation changes and really lived up to its park name. There were trams to take you around the sprawling track, which was a good thing, because the show was split into various parking areas plus the paddock area for track cars. The trams, however, got crowded as the day went on.

This option offered a choice of interesting roof coverings, unique rear window trim, a Branded emblem as well as a side stripe reminiscent of a California Special. I provided a picture of the car in this issue showing its unique flowered roof.

Speaking of pictures, I took over 400 hundred of them at the show and the two auto museums we visited while down there. I hope to have a slide show running at the meeting on the 17th. Don't forget we will be celebrating Mustang's actual birthday on that night with a cruise night followed by pizza, drinks and a birthday cake. There are more details elsewhere in this issue.
