Rich Peterson has been organizing the club's participation in this event for several years and the club was awarded an appreciation plaque for our support. The Chernacks also came in 2nd in the decoration contest. We all had a fun morning, along with the 400 or so kids that paraded by in search of candy.

GT WITH 800HP AND A WARRANTY?

Ford Performance is releasing a new Whipple supercharger, available with or without the FP800S package.

ore horsepower? No thanks, said no Ford Mustang owner, ever. Ford Performance Parts is well aware of Mustang buyers' proclivities, and has now introduced a concept FP800S performance (and style) package for the seventh-generation 2024 Ford Mustang GT. This kit will boost the GT's 5.0-liter V-8 engine (backed by a manual or automatic transmission) from 480 horsepower to about 800, courtesy of a Whipple supercharger.

With its three-year, 36,000-mile warranty and CARB compliance, this dealer—or ASE-certified mechanic—installed solution is arguably the safest and cheapest way to nearly double the newest Mustang GT's horsepower. After its SEMA debut this week, the FP800S package, as Ford calls it, will be available beginning in

2024 through the Ford Performance Parts website or your nearest Ford dealer's accessory counter.

The Ford Performance Mustang FP800S package—or at least the concept for it revealed at SEMA—includes a 3.0-liter sixth-generation twin-screw Whipple supercharger, a Ford Performance half-shaft upgrade kit, a lowering kit for optimal on-road handling, 19-inch R1 wheels in Battleship Gray, black lug nuts, FP800S graphics, a unique modular grille with gray

inserts, Ford Performance badges, a gloss black trunk applique, and floor mats with Ford Performance logos.

Although the five-oh's internals are unchanged, adding the Whipple supercharger necessitates a host of related changes: patented dual air pass, dual water pass, dual



intercooler technology; oversized heat exchanger and high flow intercooler pump; high flow, dual-beam fuel injectors; billet high flow fuel rails; integrated intercooled air-bypass system; 92mm throttle body; 120mm dual air intake system; dual high flow filters; and Tomahawk V2 flash tool with data logging capacity.

Owners can opt for a Borla Extreme cat-back exhaust system with quad 5.0-inch tips, carbon fiber pieces (front

splitter, hood vent, mirror skull caps), and Recaro seats with Ford Performance logos. The Whipple supercharger kit is available a la carte for those who want the whine sans the whole FP800S package.

Pricing has not been announced, but the similar, 700hp Ford Performance FP700

package for the 2021-2023 Ford F-150 pickup with the 5.0-liter V-8 runs about \$12,350 for the package, with about \$9,500 attributed to the Gen 5X 3.0-liter Whipple supercharger. The Ford Performance 750-hp supercharger kit for the 2018-2021 Mustang GT (M-6066-M8) features a 2.65-liter Roush supercharger and is listed on the Ford Performance Parts website for \$8,500. So expect the supercharger to run about \$10,000 and the whole package to be in the \$13,000-\$15,000 range.

If you're wondering about the mightier 2024

Mustang Dark Horse, a kit specifically for that track-focused Mustang is forthcoming. Will we see the Dark Horse approach 1,000 hp?

MUSTANGS & MERLOT

he Garden State Region Mustang Club (GSRMC) held its "Mustangs & Merlot" car show at the Brook Hollow Winery in Columbia NJ on Sunday Oct. 15, 2023. The GSRMC President is also a member of the NJ Region of the AACA, and he requested a team of AACA volunteers with some judging experience to judge the Mustangs. Doing it this way would maintain impartiality, as none of the 6 judges were displaying cars. I agreed to be one of the 6, and we were split into 3 teams of 2.

Cars were divided into classes: first, either "stock" or "modified", then by generation. (The "modified" distinction was made by GSRMC officers, and not the judges. Any cars with 3 or more mods were placed in the modified class.) My co-judge and I judged 5 stock classes: 1964-1966 cars, 1967-1970

cars, Fox-body cars, 1994-2004 cars, and 2015-2023 cars. While that sounds like a large number, there





were 6 cars in the '64-'66 class, only 2 in the '67-'73 class, only ONE Fox-body car, and only 2 cars in the

1994-2004 class. The big numbers were in the 2015-and-up class which had 11 cars. (Again, these numbers reflect cars in the STOCK class only.) I estimated that there were about 50 cars on the show field.

As a former Mustang owner and GSRMC member, I was

genuinely surprised at the very low turnout for all pre-2005 cars. Mike D., GSRMC President, whom

I've known for many years, told me a while back that club membership has taken a decided turn toward late-model vehicles. At least this speaks well of the continued enthusiasm for the Mustang among newer and presumably younger owners.

Cars were judged on workmanship and appearance (condition and cleanliness) only, so none of us were expected to be Mustang experts. Still, especially among the newer cars, judging became very tight when points were

being subtracted for demerits as small as dirty floor mats, paint nicks, and less-than-stellar engine compartments. Our task was made easier because we only had to select one winner per class. We were not looking for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners.

I took my photos before judging started, knowing that cars would leave as soon as winners were announced. In many cases, as you can see, hoods and trunks were open as required, so I had to accept that in my pictures. After the previous day's rain, everyone was thrilled that it was dry, but a brisk breeze and a peek-a-boo sun meant jackets stayed on. I greatly enjoyed being immersed ever so briefly among Mustangs again, and I saw one or two that would look really nice in my garage!

WOULD YOU SAY "YAY" OR "NEIGH" TO THIS ELECTRO-MOD MUSTANG?

he Mach-E may never be a real Mustang in many people's minds, so what will the naysayers (or should that be "neigh" sayers?) make of the Alan Mann Racing Legacy Mustang which swaps the pony's original engine for an electric motor?

The British classic car racing team has been competing with Blue Oval badged cars since the 1960s, building Cortinas and Falcons, running Ford-powered Shelby Cobras in the World GT Championship, and even GT40s. In 2004 Mann revived his team to focus on historic racing and his cars featured regularly at the Goodwood Revival and other events. Mann passed away in 2012 and it's his sons Tom and Henry who are leading this new generation of Mustang restoration.

"We have been watching the incredible growth of so-called resto-mods with interest," says Henry Mann. "We've seen cherished cars that owners want to improve, and we've seen those that owners want to future-proof, and we believe our new 1960s Mustang Coupe meets both needs."

Starting with any 1960s' Mustang donor car AMR will fully strip and restore the shell, fit double wishbone suspension with billet aluminum uprights, and upgrade the brakes to all round discs with six-piston





callipers up front and four-pot units at the rear. A regenerative braking system is also added to feed power back into the 72-kWh battery pack.

AMR says that the electrical system weighs only a little more than the original engine and transmission, and with a significantly higher 300 horsepower available the ePower Mustang can hit 60 mph in 5.2 seconds using its launch mode. Top speed is limited to a modest 97 mph, while the range on a full charge is claimed to be 220 miles. AC and DC charging is available.

On top of the electrification there's power steering and a torsen limited slip differential creating a more modern driving experience, but AMR has resisted the temptation to completely overhaul the interior. There's a focus on maintaining the period-correct look, although you will find modern racing seats, climate control, Bluetooth connectivity and a small screen.

An AMR electro-modded Mustang costs from around £200,000 (\$242,000) in the U.K. while U.S. partner Mann ePower Cars will handle builds on this side of the pond.

"This future-proofs our own business as legislation continues to tighten around the use of classic cars and combustion engines," says Mann. "We will always love the sight, sound and smell of a finely tuned internal combustion engine, but we recognize there may come a time when they are no longer viable. We believe electrification is a good way to keep these fabulous, cherished classics on the road."
